Admission Requirements:

1. Student has an Ontario Secondary School Diploma or equivalent, OR
Is 18 years of age or older on or before the program begins AND can pass a qualifying test that has been approved by the Superintendent. *
2. The approved qualifying test for this program is the Wonderlic test. A passing score for this program is 13.
3. Student must provide a Clear Medical Certificate within 45 days of the commencement of study.
4. Student must provide a clear Criminal Record Check.
5. Student must provide a clear Vulnerable Sector Check.
6. English proficiency must be demonstrated through one of the following options:
 - a) NACC Technical Literacy Exam: Passing score of 18, OR
 - b) IELTS: Minimum score of 6.0 with no subject test score lower than 5.5, OR
 - c) TOEFL: Overall 80, with the minimum in each component: Reading 20; Listening 20; Speaking 20; Writing 20.

*Applicants from other Canadian provinces must be at least 19 years of age and a minimum of 1 year out of high school by the program start date and successfully pass an academic achievement test.
