The practitioner would gain a dual registration with their existing healthcare discipline and the CTCMPAO.

Admission Requirements:

1. Must be: Registered Massage Therapist (RMT) or Physiotherapist or Chiropractor or Medical Doctor qualified to practice in Ontario. If you have an equivalent education, are retired or have an inactive registration from a registered healthcare profession, you may request an eligibility review of your application.

*Applicants from other Canadian provinces must be at least 19 years of age and a minimum of 1 year out of high school by the program start date and successfully pass an academic achievement test.

International Students: Please contact us for more details regarding admissions requirements.

Skill/Practical Requirements:

- 1. A copy of an existing vulnerable person background check is required and to be submitted prior to participating in any clinic activity. If one does not exist, it must be acquired
- 2. Students must complete all academic pre-requisites and complete 12 hours of Clinical Observation prior to participating in any clinic activity.
