Course Descriptions:

Biomedicine 1: Anatomy, Physiology, Terminology

This foundational course covers human anatomy, physiology, and medical terminology. In it, you will explore the complexities of body systems and cellular structures, mastering the language and mechanisms essential for healthcare professionals. You will gain the knowledge and confidence needed for a comprehensive understanding of health sciences.

Communication and the Healthcare Professional

This course offers a deep dive into the art and science of communication within the field of acupuncture, blending theoretical knowledge with practical skills in adapting communication styles, conflict resolution, and engaging with emotional clients. It prepares you for real-world challenges and fosters professional growth in Traditional Chinese Medicine.

Business Skills

In this course, you will gain essential business skills tailored for acupuncturists, focusing on developing and managing a successful practice. From crafting effective marketing strategies to understanding financial and legal nuances, you will learn to create a comprehensive business plan, preparing you for the dynamic world of acupuncture business management.

Research and Interpretive Studies 1

Covering cellular mechanisms to systemic conditions across dermatological, musculoskeletal, and more, it offers an in-depth examination and holistic understanding, enhancing practitioners' diagnostic and therapeutic strategies.

Advanced Physiology

The curriculum revisits and expands on foundational knowledge, preparing you for advanced clinical applications in acupuncture and holistic health practices.



Pharmacology

Biomedicine 3: Advanced Anatomy

Meridian Theory 1

The course integrates philosophical principles, practical exercises, and historical insights, empowering you with the skills to begin practicing and refining diagnostic techniques in the context of Meridian Theory.

TCM Theory Foundations 1

This course looks at the core principles of TCM, such as Yin-Yang, the Five Elements, and the intricate dynamics of Qi. It offers an exploration of how these ancient theories underpin the practice of TCM, guiding the maintenance and restoration of health. You will develop a nuanced understanding of the body's internal balance and its impact on well-being. With a blend of theoretical knowledge and practical insight, this course lays the groundwork for effective application in TCM practices, fostering a holistic approach to health and healing.

Acupuncture Point Locations 1

This course deepens your understanding of acupuncture through the study of point locations, actions, and techniques across seven meridians. You will refine your skills in diagnosing and treating with a focus on practical application, preparing you to effectively incorporate these practices into your clinical repertoire in Traditional Chinese Medicine.

Acupuncture Point Locations 2

Advance your acupuncture expertise in this Level 2 course, focusing on the precise identification and application of points across additional key meridians. You will deepen your practical skills in point location and needling, enhancing your ability to tailor treatments to individual needs within Traditional Chinese Medicine practices.

Techniques of Acupuncture 1

In this course, you will explore foundational acupuncture techniques, including needling, ear, and scalp acupuncture, alongside specialized protocols for detoxification and pain management. Clinic Modalities

In this course, you will enhance your expertise in Traditional Chinese Medicine by mastering the techniques of gua sha, cupping, and moxibustion. Engaging in immersive practice labs, you will learn to apply these modalities effectively, ensuring a holistic approach to patient care, validated through both written and practical assessments.

Diagnoses and Treatments 1

In this course, you will master the art of TCM diagnosis, learning to assess patients through traditional methods such as palpation, observation, and inquiry, including specialized techniques in tongue and pulse diagnosis. You will develop the skills to differentiate TCM patterns and apply this knowledge to formulate precise, individualized treatment strategies.

Needling Lab

In this hands-on Needling Lab course, you will refine your proficiency in acupuncture techniques, focusing on needle depth, angles, and sensitive points in line with CTCMPAO safety standards. Through extensive practice and guided instruction, you will master client draping, treatment setup, and needle handling, ensuring your readiness for direct patient care.

TCM Clinical Safety

In this course, you will delve into essential safety protocols, infection control, and risk management practices tailored for acupuncturists. Through comprehensive lessons on safe needling techniques, best practices in record keeping, and adherence to regulatory standards, you will be fully prepared for direct patient care and the CTCMPAO Safety Examination.

Modern Mental Diseases

In this course, you will explore the Traditional Chinese Medicine approach to mental health, focusing on the diagnosis and treatment of various mental disorders. Gain a holistic understanding and practical skills in addressing emotional, mood, cognitive, sleep, and behavioral conditions through TCM principles.

Modern Physical Diseases

In this course, you will explore Traditional Chinese Medicine's approach to modern physical diseases, learning to diagnose and treat a range of conditions with TCM techniques. Covering endocrine to musculoskeletal disorders, the course emphasizes integrating TCM diagnostic methods and treatments into clinical practice for holistic patient care.

Observations Student Clinic

The Observation Clinics combine theoretical classroom learning and practical clinical application, enhancing students' comprehension and confidence in treatment skills. Learners assist senior students in preparing treatment spaces, patient care, and pre/post-treatment discussions covering diagnosis, point location, and functions. Learners also become familiar with clinic management and recordkeeping skills.

Pain Management and Rehabilitation 1

Enhance your treatment strategies with advanced knowledge and hands-on application, optimizing patient outcomes for a range of disharmonies.

TCM Terminology

TCM Terminology will equip you with a comprehensive understanding and precise pronunciation of essential Traditional Chinese Medicine terms. Through immersive phonetics study and targeted terminology exercises, you will approach fluency in TCM vocabulary, enhancing your ability to communicate effectively within the domain of TCM practices and clinical settings.

TCM Pediatrics

In "TCM Pediatrics," you explore the unique aspects of pediatric care through the lens of Traditional Chinese Medicine. You learn to assess, diagnose, and treat common childhood ailments, enhancing your ability to provide tailored, effective TCM treatments for the younger population in a clinical setting.



Gynecology and Obstetrics 1

Meridian Theory 2

Through this course, students will explore Yin and Yang or the directional flow of energy to vital organs, and the interconnected network of meridians (jing luo). By understanding these concepts, students will learn techniques for assessing and balancing Qi flow to promote holistic health and vitality.

Pathophysiological Conditions 1

In this course, you delve into the etiology and pathogenesis of conditions listed in the Pan Canadian Candidate Handbook, exploring both biomedicine and TCM perspectives. You analyze how diseases manifest and affect bodily functions, enhancing your ability to identify TCM patterns in biomedicine conditions and vice versa.



Pathophysiological Conditions 2

In this course, you delve into the etiology and pathogenesis of conditions listed in the Pan Canadian Candidate Handbook, exploring both biomedicine and TCM perspectives. You analyze how diseases manifest and affect bodily functions, enhancing your ability to identify TCM patterns in biomedicine conditions and vice versa.

Direct Patient Care clinic and Oral Practical 1

In this hands-on clinical course, you will refine your diagnostic acumen and treatment application, managing patient care effectively from the first consultation. You will engage in meaningful dialogue with patients, perfect documentation skills, and collaborate with practitioners to navigate complex clinical scenarios and develop holistic treatment strategies. The course culminates in an oral exam that tests your practical understanding and adaptability.

Oriental Acupressure / Tuina 1

Tui Na 1 offers an introduction to the art of Tui Na massage therapy within the framework of Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM). This course equips students with foundational knowledge and practical skills essential for effective Tui Na practice. In this course students learn the hand techniques employed in Tui Na, understanding their application for addressing internal medical conditions.

Oriental Acupressure / Tuina 2

Tui Na 2 builds upon the foundational knowledge and practical skills acquired in Tui Na 1 and expands students' understanding and proficiency in TuiNa massage therapy within Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM). This course aims to enhance students' understanding and proficiency in Tui Na techniques and palpation skills for diagnosing and treating a wide range of conditions.

Oriental Acupressure / Tuina 3

This course on Tui Na massage therapy focuses on the tendino-muscular pathways or sinew channels. Students deepen their understanding of these pathways' structure and function and learn advanced techniques to open, treat, and close patients with depth and attention, incorporating the concept of Shen into practice. Students will develop personalized Tui Na treatments through case studies, refining their assessment and treatment skills for holistic patient care.

Tai Chi-Qigong

This course will explore the theory of the health benefits of Qigong (pronounced "chi gong) and Tai Chi, along with learning basic stances, movements and exercises through active physical participation. The student will learn the 8 pieces of Brocard (Ba Duan Jin – standing version) and a24 step series of a tai chi exercise.

Comprehensive Exams 2

In these exams, you will showcase your mastery over the extensive curriculum of Traditional Chinese Medicine and acupuncture. Designed to assess your readiness for professional practice, these comprehensive multiple-choice tests cover ideas, knowledge, and concepts studied in studied in earlier courses.

Research 2

In this course, you will engage deeply with a chosen topic in Traditional Chinese Medicine, beginning a clinical research project or literature review which will be handed in during Semester 7. This course fosters critical analysis and synthesis skills, guiding you to contribute meaningful scholarship and insights to the TCM professional community.



TCM Theory Foundations 2

In "TCM Theory Foundations 2," you deepen your understanding of Traditional Chinese Medicine, focusing on the Five Element Theory and its application in diagnosing and treating disorders. Through exploring advanced concepts like Mind, Qi, and Essence, you will enhance your ability to integrate TCM principles into effective clinical practice.

Pathophysiological Conditions 3

This course looks into the complexities of sexually transmitted infections, proctology, and external skin disorders from a TCM perspective. Integrating Western medical insights, this course empowers you to diagnose and treat sensitive conditions with confidence, enhancing your understanding of CM's holistic approach to health and its interplay with contemporary medical practices.

Gynaecology 2

In "Gynecology 2," you delve deeper into TCM gynecology, exploring patterns for pregnancy, postpartum, infertility, and more. This course empowers you to design comprehensive treatment plans, combining acupuncture and dietary strategies to address a range of female reproductive system ailments, enhancing your skills in providing holistic care.

Internal Medicine 2

In "Internal Medicine 2," you delve into the complexities of disorders affecting the Liver, Gallbladder, Kidney, and Bladder, mastering TCM classifications, symptoms, and treatment strategies. Through focused study and practical application, you enhance your ability to diagnose and tailor acupuncture treatments, advancing your proficiency in TCM internal medicine.

Internal Medicine 3

In "Internal Medicine 3," you explore TCM and Western approaches to managing sexually transmitted infections, proctology, and skin disorders. This course equips you to discern TCM patterns, apply effective treatments, and conduct sensitive patient discussions, enriching your practice with a holistic understanding of complex conditions.

Career Planning and Preparation 1

This module will introduce you to and provide practice in using the tools required for a successful job search. The concepts covered in this module will help you maintain a career-focused approach throughout your studies so that you are better prepared to conduct a job search after graduating. Specifically, you will learn how to identify your soft and hard skills and how to articulate your abilities in a clear and concise Elevator Pitch that will appeal to employers and resonate with industry contacts. You will learn about the job search resources available to you including using career websites, creating LinkedIn profiles, accessing the "hidden" job market, and networking. You will examine sample résumés and cover letters and begin the process of creating your own professional résumés and cover letters that align with current conventions for content, organization, and formatting. You will also learn about the role of references, thank you letters, workplace philosophies, and strategies for success including maintaining a professional image and using proper etiquette when communicating with potential employers and industry contacts.
