Admission requirements: Canadian High School Graduation Diploma or Mature Student Status (Mature students from Ontario must be at least 18 years of age by the program start date and successfully pass an academic achievement test. Mature students from other Canadian provinces must be at least 19 years of age and a minimum of 1 year out of high school by the program start date and successfully pass an academic achievement test). In addition, an entrance examination must be successfully passed; demonstrated fluency in English (oral) and written English (essay) and an Admission Interview to determine suitability for a career as a Community Services Worker.
