Admission requirements: Canadian High School Graduation Diploma or Mature Student Status (Mature students from Ontario must be at least 18 years of age by the program start date and successfully pass an academic achievement test. Mature students from other Canadian provinces must be at least 19 years of age and a minimum of 1 year out of high school by the program start date and successfully pass an academic achievement test). Please contact us for more detail regarding admissions requirements for international students.

- Ontario Secondary School Diploma or equivalent, or if none, they must pass a Wonderlic Test with a minimum score of 13.
- Clear Canadian Police Information Center record including Vulnerable Persons Police Check (to be provided within 45 days of commencement of study).
- A clear medical certificate indicating current immunization and free from communicable diseases (to be provided within 45 days of commencement of study).
- English Language Proficiency must be demonstrated through one of the following options:
 - NACC Technical Literacy Exam (passing score of 18)
OR
 - IELTS - International English Language Testing System – Minimum average score of 6.0 with no subject test score lower than 5.5
OR
 - TOEFL – Test of English as a Foreign Language Internet based test (iBT) – overall 80, with the minimum in each component: Reading 20; Listening 20; Speaking 20; Writing 20; and an admissions interview to determine suitability for a career as a Personal Support Worker.
